It all began in 2008, when the Past-President of the American Society of PeriAnesthesia Nurses (ASPAN) was in a London, England, pub with the Chairperson of the British Anaesthetic & Recovery Nurses Association (BARNA). They began to discuss the possibility of hosting a collaborative international conference that could include participation from other associations that were in regular contact. In the spring of 2009, the ASPAN Past President contacted the President and the President-Elect of the National Association of PeriAnesthesia Nurses of Canada (NAPAN©) and the Chairperson of the Irish Anaesthetic & Recovery Nurses Association (IARNA), to ask if their groups would be interested in creating an International Conference for PeriAnesthesia Nurses. The response was a resounding "YES!" The first meeting was held at the April 2009 ASPAN National Conference in Washington, DC, and exploratory planning began.

The organizing committee, comprised of volunteers from the four associations, arranged to meet by teleconference and email and detailed planning began. Consensus was arrived at to hold the first conference in Canada. While there are several major cities in Canada that could host the event, a decision was made to hold the inaugural conference in the largest city in the country, Toronto, Ontario, Canada. With its population of 8 million people, an airport that supports 1,000 national and international flights daily and the large number of hotels and exciting sights, recreation and entertainment options, this made Toronto a perfect choice.

Perianesthesia nursing care includes: preadmission (preoperative testing and assessment), day of surgery admission, postanesthesia recovery phase I (Recovery Room / PACU), phase II (Day Surgery / Ambulatory Care Unit / offsite surgicentres) and Extended Observation.
